Old Business:

Karena volunteered to put out our year end saddle bids on to the Facebook and website. Details such as the price, availability, pictures, and type/style will need to be included in the bid. A tentative date of May 31st is when the bids will need to be placed.

New Business:

The Senior Nutrition Program attended this meeting in order to inquire about doing a fundraiser barrel race to support the Meals on Wheels program. Currently their funding is limited through their contract, and supported from the contract budget plus senior donations. They are looking to fundraise in order to serve more meals to the elderly. If they were able to raise \$1,000 it would make about 300 meals. Ryan explained the overhead costs of producing a barrel race (venue, tractor, etc.) and it was decided it would be most profitable for them if they could get the facility donated to support the cause. There is no definite time frame for the race as of now, but winter time or early spring were discussed as possible dates.
